# ARMAGH REGIONAL MARRIAGE TRIBUNAL

While the Catholic Church upholds the dignity, sacredness, and permanence of marriage, it does not ignore the reality of separation and divorce in our society. The Marriage Tribunal in the Catholic Church is one of the ways through which the Church ministers to those struggling through broken marriages.

The Marriage Tribunal seeks to offer hope and healing for those who suffer the consequences of broken marriages. One important task is to consider the possibility of annulment. The tribunal works with individuals or couples to investigate the causes of marital failure. It attempts to determine whether the marriage was a true marital union according to the expectations and teachings of the Church and whether the parties are still bound to the vows that they made.
