

During these six weeks we are invited to take up extra prayer, fasting and almsgiving so that we can grow spiritually and be ready to celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ashes will be distributed at the Masses at 10am and 7pm.

Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence for all Catholics in good health aged between 14 and 60.

• We **fast** by eating just one normal meal

- (and also one or two small snacks if necessary).
- We abstain by not eating meat at all.
