SPEAK OF THE DEVIL

In the first reading today we are reminded of the story of the *fall* - how humanity committed its first sin by listening to the Devil and turning away from God. In the Gospel, Jesus comes face to face with the Devil himself who wants to tempt the Lord away from him mission. Jesus stands firm and ultimately defeats the Devil through his death and resurrection.

But while the Devil may be defeated, he would love us to share in his misery. He continues to tempt us to sin and to turn away from God. We need to be aware that there is great evil in the world and that without God's grace we will fall into sin very easily. Lent helps us to grow in holiness and virtue so that we can resist temptation and, with Jesus, confidently say"be off Satan!"

MASS ATTENDANCE

We recently ran a count of how many people attend Sunday Mass in our parish. The count ran over the first three weeks of February. Average Sunday Mass attendance was 403 (out of a Catholic population of 2000 in Ballymoney according to the census).

Last weekend attendance was 398 and the breakdown was 140 at the Saturday vigil, 153 on Sunday morning and 105 on Sunday evening.
