THE RAISING OF LAZARUS

We have reached the fifth week of Lent and the Church now turns its attention more fully to the passion and death of Jesus. During this last fortnight of Lent the statues and crosses in the church are veiled as a sign of grief and mourning.

Today's Gospel marks the point where opposition to Jesus became so strong that his life was in danger. If he could raise Lazarus, his enemies thought, he would have to be killed. They refused to see that if Jesus could raise Lazarus from the dead then he had the power to lay down his own life and take it up again at the resurrection. Jesus truly is the Son of God and if he can rise from the dead (and raise others too) we can always trust and hope in him.
