FINDING OUR TREASURE

in the Gospel Jesus uses the idea of discovering a treasure as a way of explaining the kingdom of heaven. He wants us to understand that God's kingdom is the most wonderful thing. Jesus goes on to ask his disciples "have you understood all this?" To understand the things of God means to really recognise them in our hearts rather than our heads.

What Jesus wants from us is not knowledge but understanding; that we don't know about him as much as we love him and have faith in him. And the more we have faith, hope and love in Jesus the more we are drawn into the kingdom of heaven. And we love it! Many Catholics we meet find religion boring. But that only means they haven't understood their faith the way that Jesus wants. This week, let's pray to have a deeper understanding of the things of God so that our faith becomes our greatest treasure and a source of joy and peace in our lives.

The pilgrimage runs until 15th August (Sun 13th Aug is final day to begin).


