JESUS WAS TRANSFIGURED

Today we celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus, when his apostles Peter, James, and John briefly saw him not just as their friend and teacher but as the Son of God, shining with the light of heaven within him. We might think that we could never be so lucky as to experience something like that - but actually what happens at Mass is even more profound. At Mass we see Jesus, the Son of God, under the form of bread and wine and we kneel before him in adoration just as the apostles did.

But before we can appreciate the majesty of Jesus we need to know him as our friend and companion in life. That's how the apostles lived - they got to know Jesus and then he showed himself as their Lord and God. We too are called to get to know Jesus through prayer and by reading the Gospels. May we grow in friendship with the Lord in the week ahead.
