We are very sorry to hear of the death of the Most. Rev, Patrick Walsh on Thursday. Bishop Walsh served as bishop of Down & Connor from 1991 to 2008, having been auxiliary bishop from 1983. He had previously taught at Garron Tower, served as chaplain to QUB and president of St Malachy's College, Belfast. May he rest in peace.
