This Third Sunday of Ordinary Time marks when the Church begins reading through a particular Gospel in sequence at Mass. This year, we'll journey through Matthew's Gospel, starting with Jesus calling his disciples.

Catholics sometimes take the Word of God for granted. Yet Scripture is God's living word to all of us. As St Jerome said, "ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ." We cannot truly know or follow God without understanding what he says and reveals about himself in the Bible. Everything essential to our faith—from the Our Father to the Mass itself—flows from Scripture. And God has so much to say to us!

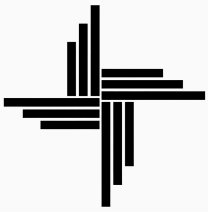

POPE LEO'S PRAYER INTENTION

Each month, the Holy Father asks for Catholics around the world to pray for a specific intention. This January Pope Leo asks us to pray "that the Word of God be nourishment for our lives and a source of hope in our communities, helping us to build a more fraternal and missionary Church."

HOW TO PRAY WITH THE BIBLE

Lectio Divina is the name for a way of praying with the bible. It consists of four simple steps that anyone can learn. You only need to take a couple of minutes for each step. Begin by taking a short bible passage (like today's Gospel).

1. Lectio (*Reading*): Slowly read the scripture passage (perhaps two or three times), paying attention to the words that seem to catch your attention.

2. Meditatio (*Meditation*): Reflect deeply on the text. What is God saying to you specifically through these words? Don't worry about understanding everything perfectly - just be present and attentive.

3. Oratio (*Prayer*): Respond to God's word. Share your heart with him. What feelings, desires, or struggles arise as you hear his message? Tell him how you feel.

4. Contemplatio (*Contemplation*): Rest in God's presence. Sometimes prayer is less about speaking and more about listening, about being still and knowing that he is God.

CANDLEMAS

The feast of the Presentation of the Lord is also known as Candlemas because it is the day when candles are blessed in the church. It takes place on **Monday 2nd February** and there will be Mass here at **10am**. Parishioners are welcome to bring candles to be blessed and hand-candles will be available to all who attend that Mass.
