

JESUS SETS US A CHALLENGE

In today’s Gospel, Jesus sets a high bar for his followers. He tells them they need to be holier than the Pharisees—the religious experts of the day who knew and followed every detail of the law. But Jesus says simply avoiding serious sin isn't enough. True holiness goes deeper. It's not just about not killing, but controlling our anger. Not just avoiding adultery, but keeping a pure heart. Not just keeping promises, but being so trustworthy we don't need to make them.

That sort of holiness requires practice - and that’s where Lent comes in. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, Lent helps us grow in self-control and generosity. Plan ahead now: when will you attend Ash Wednesday Mass? What will you give up or take on? Jesus wants us to become saints, and Lent is the perfect place to start.
