Youth Alpha Programme

Since its launch at the Faith & Life Convention in September we have had more than 80 young people and young adults involved on the Youth Alpha Programme in four centres across the Diocese including Living Youth; the Parish of Maghera, Newcastle; the Parish of St Colmcille's, Ballyhackamore and St Louis Grammar School, Ballymena. The weekly sessions run at the same time in each centre and we had the pleasure of hosting all 4 groups at Living Youth for session 4 at the end of November. Conor's ice-breakers and Kiera's meditation were well received and topped and tailed a very powerful evening.

For each session we come together to eat, socialise, play games and then we move into our small groups to consider one of the Youth Alpha Programme Topics which include: Who is Jesus? Why did He die? What is faith? How and why do we pray? Reading the Bible, the Holy Spirit, evil, healing and telling others about the Church.

Three further sessions will run in January followed by a weekend residential at Corrymeela. On residential the young people will have the opportunity to discuss, explore and develop their faith, to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to plan the next steps on the journey they



have begun with us on the Youth Alpha Programme.

GIFT Programme in Down & Connor

The Parish GIFT suite of programmes gives young people a positive experience of faith and parish, through fun activities, engaging themes, song and prayer. Coordinators and leaders from 38 parishes in Down and Connor have now been trained to deliver the Parish GIFT 1 programme in their parishes. A big thank you to the Newcastle Parish GIFT team who led the 3 training sessions in Newcastle.

Our GIFT 1 programme is parish based and proved to be a huge success with our year 8 children. The popularity of the programme culminated in a Diocesan Celebration Day in Newcastle, in June, where more than 250 children and leaders enjoyed a BBQ, treasure hunt, music, games, sports, ice-cream and a final Mass with Bishop Treanor.

Feedback from those involved in the pilot review has been very positive

with many more parishes requesting training and support this year. We are now also working with other organisations including the Irish Bishops Drugs Initiative to consider including additional modules and activities that will stretch our children further while supporting the development of their faith.

We are also delighted to announce that Parish GIFT 2 will be launched for the Lenten season 2015. This programme is for our year 9 children, particularly those who were involved in Parish GIFT 1 and wish to continue their faith journey through GIFT. Living Youth Summer Pilgrimage, Rome 2014

A group of 44 young people and leaders went on pilgrimage from Living Youth to Rome in August 2014. They enjoyed a five day non-stop journey through history, culture and faith in the eternal city. The group stayed at the beautiful Irish College and enjoyed the hospitality and assistance of the team there.

The itinerary included Santa Croce, the Vatican, St. Peter's Basilica, St. John Lateran's Basilica, the Piazza Navona, the Colosseum, the Spanish Steps, the Holy Steps, St. Paul's outside the Walls and the Catacombs.



Pope John Paul II Award

The Pope John Paul II Award gives young people the opportunity to volunteer in their parish, community and school, to be nourished in faith, to become more active members of their Church, to meet other young people, to have fun, to challenge themselves and to use and develop their talents and skills. Forty schools and parishes are now involved in the Award in Down and Connor, more than 200 young people will receive the Award in February and we have recently recruited 370 young people onto the first year.

Commitment to the Award is for sixteen months, during which time, each young person registers twenty activities in their parish and twenty activities in their community and school or with a charitable or social justice organisation. Young people finish by writing a final summary, or by attending the Living Youth Workshop Day. This year more than 60 young people and their leaders attended the Workshop Day, completed their write-up, shared pizza, talked about their faith and then joined Fr. Raymond McCullagh for Mass. Our Award Ceremony this year will be on 5th February 2015 in St. Mary's Church, Belfast.

Papal Cross Award

More than 20 of our Young Adults are currently taking part in the Papal Cross Award. As role models they are dedicated to volunteering within their parishes and communities. They are involved in assisting with activities such as the Parish GIFT Programme, Youth Alpha, school retreats, after schools clubs, music ministry and reading at Mass and we are delighted to have their help here at Living Youth, at our various youth events.

As part of the Award, our young adults are currently volunteering for 26 activities in their parishes where they will develop their own faith and that of others. They are also volunteering for 26 activities in a Social Awareness setting in which their enthusiastic and energetic personalities have already brought



hope and support as they bring various project to life. To complete the Award our young adults will do a project in which they will take responsibility for developing an activity which will benefit either their Parish or their local community.

Living Youth Habitat for Humanity Team

In the summer of 2014, 18 young people from Down & Connor travelled to Ethiopia to participate in a Living Youth Habitat for Humanity Project, accompanied by Fr. Raymond McCullagh, one of the members of the Youth Commission and a Habitat supporter for more than 10 years.



After a challenging fundraising campaign, the volunteers travelled to the host village in the heart of the country, where they were based for nearly 2 weeks, to build new homes for members of the community. Anna McAreavey, who was one of the team leaders, shares her thoughts:

"Working closely with the families who are going to own the houses is truly special. You get to build a close relationship and find out what a house means to them. Many of the families live in appalling conditions, often with no water or sanitation facilities. They feel truly blessed to have received a Habitat house and you can see from their smiles just how much it means to them. The experience is one I will never forget."
